Committees, Boards and Commissions FAQ:

Q: Who can apply?

A: We have a wide variety of committees, boards and commissions that provide valuable input and advice to City Council on a range of topics impacting our community.

Q: How do I apply to become a member?

A: We are accepting applications for vacant positions! So, if you are passionate about your community and want to have a say in that community go to Regina.ca or copy and past the link <u>Regina.ca/yourvoice</u> to APPLY NOW!

Q: Why should I apply?

A: As Regina continues to develop, it's important that the members of voluntary City Committees, Boards and Commissions reflect the diversity of our people. We need a variety of residents with ideas, skills, leadership and energy – including Indigenous, visible minorities, women and people of all abilities – to participate and share your knowledge.

Q: How long would I be a committee member?

A: For either one year or three-year staggered terms, or until their successor is appointed. For some committees, citizens aren't eligible to serve on the same committee for longer than nine consecutive years.

Q: How are members selected?

A: City Council reviews all applications at the City Council meeting and appoints the most qualified individuals in accordance with Board, Commission and Committee Governance documents.

Q: What if I'm not the successful applicant?

A: Following the City Council meeting, the City Clerk's Office will notify applicants by sending a letter with respect to the status of their application, we encourage you to apply for any future vacancies that are advertised throughout the year, on the committee(s) you chose.

Q: Are you looking for younger people to apply?

A: Yes. We believe it's important that voluntary board members reflect the diversity of our people including – Indigenous, visible minorities, people of all abilities, and women – to participate and share their knowledge.
