City Council will be considering a bylaw to amend *The Procedure Bylaw, Bylaw No. 9004* at its Wednesday, March 5, 2025, meeting at 1:00 p.m. in Henry Baker Hall, City Hall. The amendment will include the following:

“Remove the existing Proclamations Policy being section 37 and Schedule “C” from *The Procedure Bylaw, Bylaw No. 9004*.”

of Intention to Consider Debt Financing

The City of Regina hereby gives notice, pursuant to sections 101 and 102 of *The Cities Act* and *The Public Notice Policy Bylaw, 2020*, Bylaw No. 2020-28, of its intention to consider long-term debt financing for the City's proposed 5-year Capital Plan.

City Council will be considering an Operating and Capital budget which projects the potential borrowing of \$30 million in 2025 to fund various Servicing Agreement Fees Projects and \$85 million to fund the completion of the Water Network Expansion project. There will be additional discussion around Service Partners within the City and proposed debt as part of their submission, including the Regina Public Library and Regina Exhibition Association Limited.

Long-term debt financing will be considered as part of the City's Budgets by Regina City Council at its Budget meeting commencing March 17, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at Henry Baker Hall, City Hall. The debt may also be considered at subsequent meetings of Regina City Council, including on March 26, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. if budget discussions are continued past original scheduled meetings. The specific details of the potential financing will also come forward at a later date, if the borrowing is required, as City Council must pass a bylaw for long term debt financing before the City can issue a debenture or borrow any funds for that potential debt.

TO CONSIDER A SPECIAL TAX FOR ALLEY MAINTENANCE

The City of Regina hereby gives notice, pursuant to Section 275(3) of *The Cities Act* and *The Public Notice Policy Bylaw, 2020*, Bylaw No. 2020-28 of its intention to implement the 2025 special tax for alley maintenance. A special tax is levied annually for the maintenance and reconstruction of alleys throughout the city.

The report proposes a fee of \$4.04 per foot for asphalt alleys and \$2.94 per foot for gravel alleys. These amounts are payable by properties abutting a legal alley either on its rear or flank based on assessable frontage. The tax proposes raising \$5,458,040 in 2025.

The recommendation for the proposed special tax will be considered as part of the City's Budgets by Regina City Council at its Budget meeting commencing March 17, 2025 at 9:00 a.m. at Henry Baker Hall, City Hall. This item may also be considered at subsequent meetings of Regina City Council, including on March 26, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. in the Henry Baker Hall, Main Floor City Hall.
